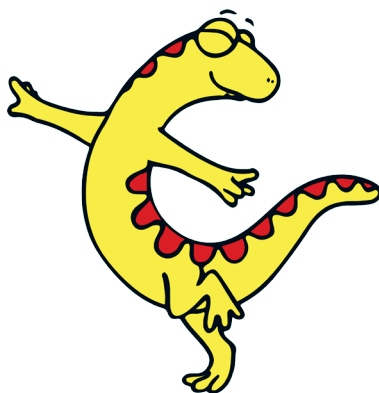

Episode 118: “Highway Robbery” - Activity 18

Provide “junk” or scrap materials (toilet paper tubes, empty oatmeal boxes, empty tissue boxes, bottle caps, etc.) and encourage your child to build a small town with “seis” (six) buildings. Have your child identify the buildings and label them with appropriate names. Leave the buildings out so your child can return to them throughout the next few days. Use the buildings to discuss the concept of a small town or neighborhood. Discuss the roles of people who live and /or work in the town buildings. Encourage your child to make stick or puppet people to represent the inhabitants of the town. Continue exploring other things that can be added to the town, such as roads, sidewalks, parks, cars, etc. Continue with the activity as long as your child’s interest remains high.



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
