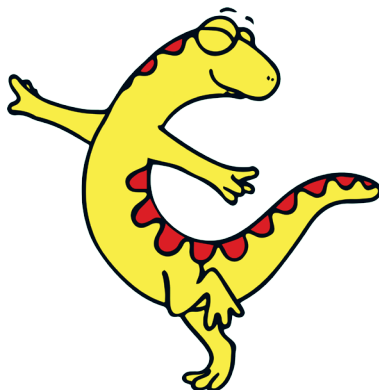

Episode 127: “Super Armadillo” - Activity 27

Purchase and wash several different-colored bunches of uvas (grapes.) Separate the varieties of grapes from their stems and place them in a serving bowl. After washing hands, provide your child with a large spoonful or handful of “uvas” and a large piece of clean paper towel or a tray on which to place them. Ask your child to sort the grapes by color. Ask your child to identify the colors of the grapes, using appropriate Spanish vocabulary (rojas, verdes, moradas, etc.) Ask your child to find other ways to sort the grapes (e.g., grandes, medianas, and pequeñas). Have your child sort in as many ways possible, describing the sorts using either Spanish or English vocabulary. Have your child count the grapes and then consume for snack. (Note: Remember to consider any food allergies before providing snacks to a child.)



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
