

# How to Plan and Submit Your News Story

You're telling a story that matters—so let's make it count!

## Step 1: Make sure your story is newsworthy.

A great news story has a clear **beginning**, **middle**, **and end**, and includes **compelling people or events**. Focus on a full story—not just a fun fact.

Your story should include at least **THREE** of these five elements:

- □ **Timeliness** Is it happening now or recently?
- □ **Proximity** Is it local or relevant to your community?
- □ **Conflict/Controversy** Is there a problem or debate?
- □ **Human Interest** Is it meaningful or relatable?
- □ **Relevance** Why should others care?

## Step 2: Develop your story.

Check the Storyblocks Chart for what's required according to your prompt. Multiple interviews may be needed—read carefully!

- □ Why is this story meaningful?
- □ Who is it about?
- □ When did it happen?
  - □ specific date and time
- $\Box$  Where did it happen?
  - □ specific place
- $\Box$  Why is it important?
- □ **How** did things unfold?

## **U** Step 3: Plan your reporting.

Think through:

- $\rightarrow$  What parts of the story you already know
- $\rightarrow$  What you still need to research
- $\rightarrow$  Who you'll interview or what sources you'll use

Use primary sources and real interviews whenever possible.

- □ Collect contact info from everyone you interview.
- □ Anyone under 18 on camera? Get a signed <u>Student Release Form</u>.

## Step 4: (REQUIRED) Write and feature photo your story.

- □ Headline + subhead
- □ At least 3–5 paragraphs of well-organized body text
- □ At least one feature photo with a caption
- □ Format: Word Doc or PDF (story) + JPEG (photo)

#### Step 5: (OPTIONAL) Add multimedia!

- □ Audio: Combine story + interviews in one MP3 file. No music.
- □ Photo Essay or Slideshow: Upload JPEGs to bring your story to life.
  - □ Don't forget the signed <u>Student Release Form</u> for anyone under 18.
- □ Video Story: Create a short video version of your news story.
  - □ Review the <u>PBS News Hour skills checklist</u> before filming.
  - □ Use HD/4K video, good lighting, clear audio, and proper framing.
  - □ Avoid background noise and music.
  - □ Include an establishing shot and some B-roll footage.
  - □ Don't forget the signed <u>Student Release Form</u> for anyone under 18.

#### Step 6: Submit your story via the SVC Story Submission Form.

- □ Your written story (Word or PDF)
- □ Your feature photo (JPEG)
- □ Completed <u>Student Release Form(s)</u>
