How to Produce and Submit Your New Story ☐ Choose a prompt. ☐ Plan your story using the Story Submission Checklist and Story Blocks Organizer. ☐ Record interviews (audio or video) and take photos of your interviewees. ☐ Encourage each person to speak for a few minutes about their thoughts. ☐ Write your story using the Story Submission Checklist and Story Blocks Organizer. ☐ Submit your final story package via the Story Submission Form.
▶ Prompt 1: What Did You Learn? A Spotlight on Seniors Story Focus: What skills and lessons will seniors carry into life after graduation? □ Research: Look for news stories about college, career prep, or what helps graduates feel ready for adulthood. □ Interview: at least THREE seniors. Ask: What is the most important skill you learned this school year? Do you feel prepared for what comes next? What advice would you give to younger students or to your younger self?
★ Prompt 2: Beyond Scrolling – Students on Goal-Setting and Achievement Story Focus: How do students manage digital distractions to achieve their goals? □ Research: Read about student trends in goal setting—academic, financial, health and wellness, creative, personal achievement, community service, etc. □ Interview: at least THREE students. Ask: What is one goal you haven't reached yet this year? Why? How do you plan to achieve this goal? Will it benefit you and/or your community? How will you adjust your time or screen use to make it happen?
Prompt 3: Open Choice Story Focus: Report on a student perspective about a current issue or topic that matters to your school community (e.g., cell phone use, dress code, school safety). ☐ Research: What is the background or history of this issue at your school? ☐ Interview: at least THREE students. Ask: ○ What is your opinion on the issue? ○ What changes or solutions would you like to see?
